Subject: PERFORMING ARTS

Year Group: 10



In KS4 we follow Pearson's BTEC Tech Award in Performing Arts. This examination course is made up of 3 components; 2 internally assessed and externally moderated, and 1 externally examined. Students receive five lessons over a fortnightly timetable, in which there is a double practical lesson as well as timetabled ICT sessions in which coursework is completed. Although there is a coursework element, the context is taught though practical workshops and experiences. Yr10 is used to complete Component 1.
