Subject: GCSE Photography

Year Group: 10



This document details the structure of the GCSE Photography course at Chase High School. The course is run over two years and the students complete a variety of sustained investigations as required by the AQA specification. Whilst the time frames for the projects remain the same, there is a selection of different briefs available to swap in place of others depending on the cohort of students and their differing needs. The different themes cover different aspects of photography such as portraiture, still life, digital manipulation and working to a brief. All lesson PowerPoints and resources as well as the student's personal hand in folders are available to find in the courses allocated workspace folder. Key themes and activities are listed below; however, time is also built in for students to create their portfolios.
