

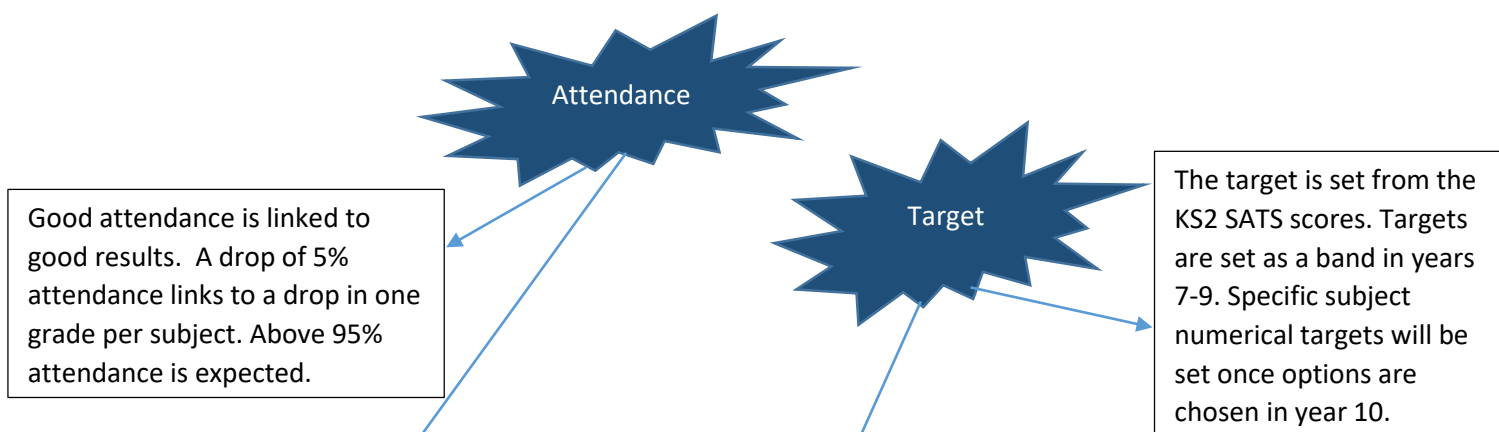


## Understanding your child's KS3 report

Chase High School sends home Progress Reports which let parents and carers know whether or not the work produced by the student is in line with what is expected of a child of the same age and ability. This is known as being "on target".

Students are given a target band based on their performance in their Year 6 SATS. Each subject has organised the teaching to show what students need to be able to do to perform at that level/target band. Students can also see what they need to be able to do if they want to improve their work. The document that shows this for each subject is known as a Qualitative Progress Grid or QPG for short. The colours on the QPG relate to the target bands – Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze.
