

Headteacher's Comment:

As headteacher at Chase, I experienced the Remembrance day event here for the first time on Friday. It would be an understatement to simply say I am proud of our students, they were impeccably behaved and respectful throughout. All week, Mr Mustafa has delivered assemblies leading to the Remembrance event and weekend. The focus of the assembly was the 75th anniversary of the ship Empire Windrush's arrival at Tilbury docks, carrying thousands of people from the Caribbean to settle and help rebuild Britain in the decades after the Second World War. Hundreds of the passengers were current or former RAF personnel and our students learnt of the 16000+ Caribbean men and women who volunteered to serve, and support Britain during and after the war.

This week has also seen a number of trips, events and activities take place or return, and I would like to reiterate how I am extremely proud of the behaviour and attitude of our students when they leave the confines of the school and represent themselves, the school and you as parents and carers. However, none of these extracurricular events would be possible if it wasn't for the staff who go above and beyond, giving up time with their own families to provide our students with a variety of experiences, from a thrill seeking visit to Rolla City to a residential stay in the amazing city of Berlin, so a heartfelt thank you to them.

Highlights of the tour included a visit to Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp and an evening looking down on Berlin from the TV Tower. Some of our Year 10 students are shown at the Olympic Stadium in Berlin - the place where Jessie Owens won his four gold medals in 1936.
