The BTEC Tech Award gives learners the opportunity to develop sector-specific knowledge and skills in a practical learning environment. Learners are assessed throughout Year 10 and 11.

The main focus is on four areas of equal importance, which cover the:

- development of key skills that prove aptitude in health and social care such as interpreting data to assess an individual's health
- process that underpins effective ways of working in health and social care, such as designing a plan to improve an individual's health and wellbeing
- attitudes that are considered most important in health and social care, including the care values that are vitally important in the sector, and the opportunity to practice
